

Feb. 28th, 1963

The first official meeting was called to order with all being present.

A discussion was held as to whether or not the city should have a census taken at the present time. It was decided that the city would wait before taking this action.

Ald. Haynes brought up a proposed plan for a future garbage disposal. It was decided that he should look into possible sites for a disposal. He stated that the City of Jasper would like to buy property for a disposal for themselves and that they might buy one large area with the City of Kimball.

M. Hill disclosed that the County Road Commission would help Kimball keep their roads in working condition until funds from the State started into the office.

Ordinance #1 was presented to the board members. This ordinance states the form of ordinances to be used by the City. A motion was made by Ald. Haynes and seconded by Ald. Shook that this ordinance be passed.

A motion was made by M. Hill and seconded by Ald. Shook that a beer board be set up with the aldermen acting as such board. The Mayor will preside as chairman. Ordinance #2 regarding the sale of beer was presented to the members. A motion was made by Ald. Haynes and seconded by M. Hill that this ordinance be passed.

A motion was made by Ald. Shook and seconded by Ald. Haynes that the City take out a bank note in the amount of \$150.00 to cover debts incurred during the election.

A motion was made by M. Hill and seconded by Ald. Haynes that Ordinance #3 creating the office of Recorder and Treasurer be passed.

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It was decided that Patty Hill would act in this capacity until such time the City would be able to pay someone to fill this position.

A motion was made and seconded that the meeting come to an end.

March 14, 1963

The meeting was called to order with all members being present.

The minutes were read and were approved.

All old business was called for discussion. At this time Ordinance #1, Ordinance #2, and Ordinance #3 were brought up for their second reading. All three were read before the board and voted upon. The vote was to pass all three.

T.V.A. map #100SW was presented to the board by M. Hill. This map was used in conjunction with the registered City Charter to decide the official city limits. It was discovered at this time that the boundaries took in six families who had been told previously that they would not be taken in. Even though no member of this board was responsible for this occurrence, it was decided that letters of apology be sent.

The meeting was called to order with all members being present.

The minutes were read and approved.

At this time all old business was requested. The third and final reading of Ordinance #1, Ordinance #2, and Ordinance #3 was given. All three ordinances were voted on and passed. At this time they were signed by the Mayor and Aldermen thus becoming effective.

The only new business was that a State official had been contacted about putting up signs indicating the city limits. A discussion was held in order to find some solution to the problem of speeding traffic in the City. No answer to this problem was found at this time.

A motion was made and seconded at this time that the meeting come to a close.

April 25, 1963

The meeting was called to order with the Mayor and Alderman Haynes being present. Old business was brought up, but there was none to discuss at this time. A discussion was held regarding the damage done to city property by the construction company representing the City of South Pittsburg. At this time new business was called for, and a motion was made by Alderman Haynes that this situation be made known to the proper officials of South Pittsburg. This motion was seconded by Mayor Hill. Mayor Hill brought up the fact that the State was requiring an authorized census before our city could be added to the State roll. A motion was made and seconded that we have local citizens take and prepare a census subject to State authorization. A motion was made and seconded that the meeting adjourn.

The meeting was called off because a majority of members were unable to attend.

May 23, 1963

The meeting was called to order with the Mayor and Ald. Haynes being present. The minutes were read and approved for the last meeting. A Treasurer's report was called for and could be given due to the start of incoming funds. The amount of \$167.89 had been received for wholesale beer tax. At this time old business was called for, and Ald. Haynes referred to the damage to city streets. A motion was made and seconded to have the roads resurfaced as soon as possible. The Marion Co. Highway Dept. was to do the required work, and the cost would be placed on a contract. Other old business brought up was the city census. The census had been completed and it showed the the population to be 716 persons. This census was forwarded to the State Planning Commission for authorization. Mayor Hill brought up the business formally discussed regarding damage responsible by So. Pittsburg. He had made a complaint to Judge Cowan and Mayor Lloyd regarding said damage. They agreed to repair all areas damaged by their representatives. A motion was made and seconded that the meeting adjourn.

The meeting was called to order with the Mayor and Ald. Haynes being present. The minutes were read and approved from the previous meeting. Old business was called for at this time. A report was given regarding the progress of repairs and road work. This report was found to be satisfactory. New business was called for, and the problem of having the city limits marked was presented. Ald. Haynes and Mayor Hill both agreed to investigate this matter. There wasn't any more new business at this time. A motion was made and seconded that the meeting adjourn.

The meeting was called to order with the Mayor and Ald. Haynes being present. The minutes were read and approved of the previous meeting. The Treasurer's report was given. The General Fund had \$173.52 at this time. Old business was called for, and it was made known that the signs showing the city limits would be put up by the State. There was no more new business at this time. A discussion was held pertaining to the problem of waste disposal. No motions were made at this time regarding this problem. A motion was made and seconded that the meeting adjourn.

The meeting was called off due to illness.

July 25, 1963.

The meeting was called to order with the Mayor and both Aldermen being present. The minutes on the last meeting were read and approved. Old business was called for at this time. Ald. Haynes brought up the necessity of a suitable garbage dump. He made a motion that the City of Kimball go in together with the City of Jasper and purchase such a place. This motion was seconded, and certain property belonging to Reece Harris was selected for the site. A bank note at the First National Bank was due, and it was decided that it should be paid off. There was no new business at this time. A motion was made and seconded that the meeting close.

The meeting was called to order with Mayor Hill and Ald. Haynes being present. The minutes were read and approved of the previous meeting. Old business was called for at this time. A report was given of the progress of the city dump, and a map of this site was presented to this city by the City of Jasper. New business was called for, and it was made known that a bank note was due. A motion was made and seconded that this note be paid in full. There was no more new business so a motion was made and seconded that the meeting be closed.

August 22, 1965

The meeting was called to order with Mayor Hill and Ald. Haynes being present. The minutes were read and approved of the previous meeting. Old business was called for at this time. A report was given on the progress of the city dump. A report was given on the progress of the city streets. It was disclosed at this time that the street running by Jack Lynch's property needed extra work. A motion was made and seconded that the street be repaired so that future expense would be reduced. Both reports showed satisfactory progress. There was no new business at this time, and a motion was made and seconded that the meeting adjourn.

The meeting was called off.

Sept. 26, 1964

The meeting was called to order with Mayor Hill and both Aldermen being present. The minutes for the previous meeting were read and approved. Old business was called for at this time. A report on the garbage dump was given and a discussion was held in order to present these facilities to the public. The treasurer's report was called for at this time. The General Fund had \$1,403.83 and the Road Fund had \$772.10. There was no new business at this time. A motion was made and seconded that the meeting adjourn.

The meeting was called to order with all City Officials being present. The minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved. Old business was called for at this time. Reports were given on progress of street repairs. A report was given on progress of city dump, and a complaint was made by Mr. Joe Blevins about out of town people dumping garbage on his personal property. A motion was made and seconded that signs be put out to prevent further dumping. It was brought up that the State so far had failed to put up City Limit signs as they had promised. Mayor Hill was appointed to remind the official that the signs had not been erected. A discussion was held regarding the speed problem through the city. Mayor Hill was appointed to investigate the possibility of assistance from the State Highway Patrol in this matter. There was no more new business at this time and a motion was made and seconded that the meeting adjourn.

Oct. 24, 1963

The meeting was called to order with Mayor Hill and Ald. Haynes being present. The minutes were read and approved from the last meeting. Old business was called for, and Mayor Hill made his report on his talk to the State Highway Patrol Dept. It was discovered that they could only come in to the City on business during the time of school buses. The possibility of putting up more speed signs was discussed. Other reports were given on the garbage dump and street repairs. There was no more new business so a motion was made and seconded that the meeting adjourn.

The meeting was called to order with all Officials being present. The minutes from the last meeting were read and approved. The treasurer's report was given as follows- General Fund. \$1,987.20 and Road Fund \$624.57. There was no old business to discuss at this time. New business was called for at this time. A report was given about the possibility of obtaining the now vacated school property for the City. Mayor Hill and Mr. James Beene had approached Mr. Forrester in behalf of the people of Kimball to request that this property be turned over to the City. He said that such a move could not be done. A motion was made and seconded that more inquiries be made on this matter. It was decided that the County School Board should be approached. There was no more new business, and a motion was made and seconded that the meeting adjourn.

Nov. 28, 1963

The meeting was called to order with the Mayor and Ald. Haynes being present. The minutes from the last meeting were read and approved. Old business was called for at this time. A report was given on the garbage dump and street repairs. It was brought up that the garbage dump had now been completed, and all street repairs had been completed. M. Hill made his report on his discussion with Mr. Bob Mosely about the School Property. He had been advised by Mr. Mosely that there was a strong possibility that the property would be deeded to the City. He agreed to bring up the matter at the next School Board Meeting. The motion was made and seconded that the meeting adjourn.

Dec. 12, 1963

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The meeting was called to order with Mayor Hill and Ald. Haynes being present. The minutes from the last meeting were read and approved. Old business was called for at this time, and Mayor Hill notified the City Officials the County School Board had agreed to deed the Kimball School Property to the City with one reservation. This reservation was revealed to be that they reserved the right to use the property if it was needed for school purposes. There was no more new business and a motion was made and seconded that the meeting come to a close.
