March 12, 1964.

The meeting was called off.

April 9, 1964.

The meeting was called to order with Ald. Haynes and Mayor Hill being present. Ald. Shook was unable to attend due to absence pertaining to business. Old business was called for at this time. It was announced that the City Garbage Dump was not open to the public because of the poor road conditions. Ald. Haynes was appointed to speak to the County Road Commissioner about correcting this condition. There wasn't any additional old business so new business was called for. A discussion about the condition of the streets in Kimball was held. It was decided that the streets needed to be re-surfaced after the drainage problem on the Cove Rd. was corrected. Mayor Hill made a motion that the City contact Pete Graham in order to get the needed repairs made by the County. The motion was seconded by Ald. Haynes. A discussion was held about the traffic in the city. It was pointed out that numerous accidents had occurred within the City Limits in the past few weeks. A motion was made and seconded that the City hire a policeman to handle the traffic problem. Gordon Marie was the unanimous choice for the position. A motion was made and seconded that the meeting come to a close.

April 23, 1964.

The meeting was called to order with Mayor Hill and Ald. Haynes being present. Ald. Shook was unable to attend due to absence from the City. The minutes were read and approved from the last meeting. A report from the Treasurer was made as follows: Gen. Fund. \$4,123.16 Road Fund. \$ 536.37. At this report all bills and contracts had been paid off. Old business was called for and Ald. Haynes gave a report on the condition of the road to the Garbage Dump. Since the road was useable, a motion was made and seconded that the Recorder secure prices on the printing of circulars telling about the New Garbage Dump. Mr. Graham was also contacted about repairing the drainage problem on the Cove Rd., and it was reported that the City must first check with the State Highway Dept. in order to prevent improper drainage on the State Highway. The Recorder was requested to write the Highway Dept. and get said information. A report was made informing the City that Gordon Marie agreed to accept the job of patrolling the City. He agreed to do so without charge for thirty days at the end of which he would be put on a salary. This salary would be fixed to coincide with the number of hours that he would be able to spend. New business was called for and it was decided that three new ordinances needed to be put into effect. A motion was made and seconded that Ordinance # 4 pertaining to the sale of fireworks be passed. A motion was made and seconded that Ordinance # 5 pertaining to the dumping of garbage within the city limits be passed. A motion was made and seconded that Ordinance # 6 pertaining the traffic regulations be passed. The possibility of adding two traffic lights was discussed and it was decided that the discussion would be carried over to the next meeting. At this time a motion was made and seconded that the meeting come to a close.

May 7, 1964.

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The meeting was called to order with all members being present. This meeting was held on Friday instead of Thursday so Ald. Shook could be present. The minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved. At this time old business was called for, and a report by Mayor Hill was given on his meeting with the State Representative on the highway drainage problem. The State agreed to make necessary adjustments on highway after the City enlarged the drainage tiles on the Cove Road. Ordinance #4 prohibiting the sale of fireworks was read and passed by a 3-0 vote. Ordinance #5 regulating garbage disposal was read and passed by a 3-0 vote. Ordinance #6 regulating traffic was read and passed by a 3-0 vote. This completed the old business. New business was called for at this time, and a motion was made and seconded that the City obtain an estimate on having the roads covered with two good coats of black-topping and putting in the tiles on the Cove Road. A motion was made and seconded that Kimball have some traffic lights put up at two desirable locations. Mayor Hill was appointed to see Mr. Powell at the Co-op and get the necessary information. Charles Hill was elected by the officials to take the office of City Recorder. A motion was made and seconded that the meeting come to a close. Patty Hill

May 22, 1964.

The meeting was called to order with all members being present. The meeting was again held on Friday so Ald. Shook could be present. The minutes were read and approved from the last meeting. The Treasurer gave a report as follows: Gen. Fund. \$4,816.15 Road Funds. \$ 885.82. At this time old business was called for, and a progress report on the County's work on tiles was given. It was felt that the progress was slow in comparison with the cost so a motion was made and seconded that the work be called to a stop at the present time. The mayor gave his report on information secured about placing traffic lights in the City. He was then asked by the council to contact the Seis Electric Co. and have a representative come out and advise the City on the placement any type lights to be used. Ordinance #4 was read and unanimously passed. Ordinance #5 was read and received a majority of votes. Ordinance #6

was read and passed by a unanimous vote. Charlie Hille agreed to accept the position of Recorder and agreed to assume responsibilities in the month of ~~June~~^{July}. A motion was made and seconded that the Recorder be paid a salary in the amount of \$25.00 a month. This completed the old business, and new business was called for at this time. A discussion was held about having a local person clean out the remaining tiles other than these on the Cove Rd. A motion was made and seconded that the City hire a local person to do this job and clean off the school property. His salary was fixed at \$1.25 an hour. This completed the new business, and a motion was made and seconded that the meeting adjourn.

Patty Hill

(This was the third and final reading of Ordinances #4, #5, and #6)

The meeting was called to order with Mayor Hill and Alderman Haynes being present. The minutes from the previous meeting were read and stood approved as read. The Recorder gave a report on the current financial standing of the City. (Gen. Fund. \$6,025.94 - Road Fund \$1,440.45 with one bill due in the amount of \$553.99) Old business was called for at this time, and the estimates received from the State and the County on road repairs were given. State estimate was \$12,400.00, and it covered putting two good surfaces on all roads and completing the tile work on the Cove Rd. Approximately \$2,000.00 of this estimate was for the tile work leaving \$10,400.00 for the road work. The County's estimate was \$8,000.00 and covered putting two good surfaces on all roads in the City. A motion was made by Ald. Haynes and seconded by Mayor Hill that the County be given the contract in as much as their estimate was over \$2,000.00 less. A report was given on the street lights to be placed on the Highway, and it was reported that the representative had failed to come and advise the City on lights. It was decided that they should be contacted again. A letter from the School Board was read in regard to the school property in Kimball. It was noted that the wording regarding the lease of said property was identical to the previous one, and it did not make any provisions in regard to money spent on property by the City of Kimball. A motion was made by Mayor Hill and seconded by Ald. Haynes that the letter be turned over to a School Board Member. Ordinance #7 in regard to the levy of a pole tax in the City was read and passed with both Ald. Haynes and Mayor Hill voting for its passage. This completed old business and new business was called for at this time. Ald. Haynes brought up a dispute over a property line that might involve the City. The dispute is between Mr. Cologne Phipps and Mr. Marvin Turner. The road-way which is claimed by both parties is located between the Junction and the old Battle Creed Rd. At the present time Attorney representing Mr. Phipps was running a title investigation, and the City would be notified of his findings. There wasn't any further new business to take up at this time so a motion was made and seconded that the meeting be adjourned.

July 10, 1964.

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The meeting was called to order with Mayor Hill and Ald. Haynes being present. The minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved. Old business was called for at this time. Ald. Haynes turned into the City a suggested plan for lights regulating traffic. This plan had been submitted to him by the Crouse-Hinds Company representative. It was decided after a lengthy discussion that before voting on this plan that they should talk to the representative again. This completed the old business and new business was requested. Mayor Hill brought up a problem occurring around the garbage dump. Mr. Reece Harris had filed a complaint about garbage being dumped on his property instead of the City dump. It was decided that a representative from Kimball should meet with a representative from Jasper and sufficiently mark the boundaries of the dump. After this was done, the City should have Mr. Harris's property cleaned off. Ordinance #7 was then read and a vote taken. It passed with both Mayor Hill and Ald. Haynes voting for its passage. This completed all new business and a motion was made and seconded that the meeting be adjourned.

Sept. 25, 1964.

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The meeting was called to order with Ald. Haynes and Mayor Hill being present. Old business was called for, and a report was given on the work on the city streets. Mayor Hill stated that all work was completed except the work on the Cove Rd. which needed additional tile work first. He presented the itemized statement and contract from the County. A vote was taken to pay the whole amount rather than use the contract. This vote was carried in the affirmative, and it was decided the required amount be transferred from the General Fund to the Road Fund to pay this bill off. Other old business brought up was that there was still trouble over the disputed road running between the Turner property and Phipps property. Several complaints had been made the Mayor Hill had talked to Mr. Turner and persuaded him to leave the road open. There was no new business at this time so a motion was made and seconded to adjourn.

Nov. 26, 1964.

A special meeting was called for the purpose to take some definite step in settling the problem over the road running through the boundary of the Phipps and Turner property. Many complaints were made by persons having to use said road to get to the highway. A motion was made and seconded to turn the information over to Attorney Jerome Ables and have him take the necessary steps. The City of Kimball was to pay for a survey and then take necessary steps to keep the road open.
