

January 26, 1967

The Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Kimball, Tennessee, met at regular meeting on the 26th day of January, 1967. All members were present.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. Financial report was given.

Mayor Bennett compared the beer tax collections for December of 1966 and January of 1967, and pointed out that there had been an increase of approximately \$500.00 in beer tax receipts. It is his opinion that this increase is due to sales made by Willie's Food Giant which has just recently started business in Kimball.

The County sales tax referendum was discussed in reference as to whether or not Kimball should agree to a distribution whereby if the referendum is passed, the Town would receive less than is provided by general law. No formal action was taken but all members were of the opinion that distribution should be made under the provisions of general law. However, the question was left open until additional information as to the amount of additional money needed by the schools was furnished to the Town.

The Board unanimously approved the appointment of Homer Dawson, Jr. and Bill Bynum, as special policemen for Kimball, which had heretofore been made by Mayor Bennett, with the specific understanding that no salary was to be paid to Homer Dawson, Jr. and Bill Bynum, by the Town of Kimball.

The purchase of the Kimball School property from the Marion County Board of Education was discussed. All members were in agreement that the Town should purchase the property if it could be obtained for a reasonable price and the Town Attorney was directed to continue negotiations with the Board of Education, and was further directed to inform the Board of Education that the Town of Kimball intended to use the building for general community purposes and make it available for public meetings for such purposes as use by the Lions Club, Boy Scouts and other public meetings.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen is advised that the Marion County Board of Education has no further need for the Kimball School property for school purposes; and that the said Board of Education is willing to sell the property;

WHEREAS, the Town of Kimball owns no building or real estate upon which to construct a building which can be used for municipal purposes;

WHEREAS, it appears to the Board of Mayor and Aldermen that it would be for the best interest of the Town to purchase the said Kimball school property if the same can be purchased at a reasonable price; and

WHEREAS, it appears to said Board that the Town can afford to pay the sum of \$ 10,000.00 and the said property would be worth said amount to the Town of Kimball, and there being no other available and suitable property known to the Board, which can be purchased by the Town.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it resolved by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Kimball, Tennessee, that Mayor G. H. Bennett be and he is hereby authorized and directed to offer the Marion County Board of Education the sum of \$ 10,000.00 for the Kimball School property and that in the event said offer is accepted, he is further authorized to have the property surveyed at the Town's expense, so that conveyance can be made by deed describing the property by metes and bounds.

Alderman Shook is to check all streets in the city limits and any needed repairs will be made by County Highway department.



The Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Kimball met on Thursday, July 27th, 1967, at the Town Office. All members were present.

It was agreed to authorize the Mayor to employ a certified public accountant, or public accountant, to prepare an audit for the Town.

The statement of dues from the Tennessee Municipal League was presented to the Mayor and it was decided to continue the Town's membership in the Municipal League and payment of the dues was authorized.

Mayor Bennett announced that certain persons had raised the question as to the advisability of keeping the boundaries of the Town at Sweeden's Cove road, and the suggestion had been made that the boundaries should be changed so that the southern boundary of the Town would be the meanders of Battle Creek, rather than Sweeden's Cove road. After discussion it was decided that since an election would be required to change the boundaries, no further action would be taken on this at the present time.

Mayor Bennett announced that the Town had been requested to name a U.N. Day chairman for the Town of Kimball, and that he was appointing Leonard Peoples as U.N. Day chairman. This action was approved by the Board.

The need for additional recreational facilities for the Town was discussed and all members agreed that Mayor Bennett be authorized to plan construction of a tennis court upon the Town property and expend an amount for this purpose not to exceed \$500.00.

The question of the sale of beer on Sunday was discussed, and it was unanimously agreed that the Town attorney be directed to prepare such an amendment to the beer ordinance as is required to authorize the sale of package beer on Sunday.

They also pointed out that the Church of Christ and Kimball Baptist Church are a very short distance from all residents and businesses along Highway 41 to within the vicinity of Van Hoosier's Store toward Jasper and Driver's Inn or beyond toward South Pittsburg.

After a discussion on the request, Alderman Shook made a motion that no beer be sold along Highway 41 in the area from Van Hoosier's Store to and including Driver's Inn Service Station, or in any of the residential areas of the Town of Kimball. The motion was seconded by Mayor Bennett, and Alderman Shook, Alderman Peoples, and Mayor Bennett all voted in favor of this motion. The commission felt that it was only fitting and proper that this action be taken.

The Audit of the books has not been completed at this time.



The application was made and signed by Mayor Bennett and mailed to Commissioner of Tennessee Highway Department on September 15, 1967.


Mayor Bennett reported on the business trip to Nashville concerning the Industry and explained why the decision was to locate on the Beets property, now owned by F. E. Rollins.
