The Board of Mayor and Aldermen held it's regular meeting Sept. 26, 1968, at 7:00 PM. All being present.

Mayor Bennett presented the States requirements and specifications to proposed Kimball lane improvement, which will require the moving of utilities, water and gas service lines, and meters. Cutting of trees and having the necessary right of way. This will create a sizeable cost to the Town, which cost is not available at this time. Action on any part of this will not be made until such information is available.

No information has been received from the State concerning the Traffic lights.

Complaints from various residents, concerning shooting of fire arms inside the City limits, was recieved by Mayor Bennett. The Board agreed to adopt an Ordinance prohibiting the firing of fire arms inside the City limits

Alderman Shook agreed to meet with members of the Jasper Commission to discuss means of making the dump more useable. Alderman Shook reported that no one from Jasper showed up. Since this time we have received a bill for one third of the cost for bull-dozing the dump ground. The bill was promptly paid and we assume that this was what Jasper had in mind.

South Pittsburg water department has agreed to install fire hydrants on U. S. Highway 41 and will start as soon as they can get to it.

There being no other business at this time, the meeting was adjourned.

Mayor Bennett reported that a check for \$750.00 had been given to Judge Hughes for Kimballs share in helping financially to hire an Industrial Specialist. This amount represents \$1.00 per person in Kimball.

The Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the town of Kimball met at regular meeting on August 23, 1968. All members were present and the minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. A financial report was also given. Mayor Bennett pointed out that the town of Kimball in the last month received beer tax in the amount of \$914.59.

The speeding problem in Kimball was considered by the Board and the Mayor reported that he had contacted the Traffic Engineer's office of the Highway Department and Mr. Williams had advised him that the Department would cooperate in an effort to do something to slow down the traffic. He stated that a representative of the Department had already been in Kimball in reference to making a traffic survey. All members agreed that a stop light was needed at Kimball Lane and possibly two caution lights.

Mayor Bennett was authorized by members of the Board to negotiate with the town of South Pittsburg in reference to installing fire hydrants along U. S. Highway 41 where water mains and tees are available.

Judge Hughes' proposal that the town approve some funds to help pay the expenses of an Industrial Specialist was considered. All members agreed that Kimball would participate if the other municipalities of the County would pay on a proportionate basis. The suggestion was made that \$1.00 per person per year based upon the official census of the town might be a reasonable contribution if other municipalities would

agree to such a matter. A resolution asking that Highway 41 be made a scenic route was unanimously passed.

There being no futher business the meeting was adjourned.
