 Trust & Banking in Jasper.


The South Pittsburg Municipal Water Works has received fire plugs for installation in Kimball and will be installed as soon as possible.

Attorney Swafford is to write to State Engineer concerning the traffic and caution lights which we have been trying to secure for the Town.

The Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Kimball met at regular meeting on Thursday, February 27, 1969, at 7:00 p.m. Present at the meeting were Mayor Bennett and Alderman Peoples. Alderman Shook was absent. The oath of office was administered to Mayor Bennett and Alderman Peoples, since they were elected to a new term by election held on February 8, 1969. Alderman Shook will take the oath of office at a later date. It was decided that the Town should enter into a contract with the State of Tennessee Highway Department for construction of an industrial access road to the Tennessee Metallurgical Corporation and upon motion duly passed, resolutions were adopted authorizing the Mayor to enter into a contract with the State of Tennessee Department of Highway for construction of said road and a resolution, authorizing the borrowing of up to \$3,000.00 to pay the cost of relocating utilities. Both resolutions are hereinafter set out.

Police protection was discussed and Mayor Bennett was directed to investigate the possibility of getting the present employee to work longer hours and to make recommendations as to any salary increase. It was decided to investigate the possibility of purchasing and installing a fire sirene for the Town.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

The Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Kimball, Tenn., held its regular meeting on March 18, 1969, all members and Attorney Swafford being present.

The minutes were read and discussion of business proceeded.

Attorney Swafford presented the Ordinance for Construction of An Industrial Road to the Commission and it was voted to authorize Mayor Bennett to enter into a Contract in reference there to with the State of Tennessee, Dept. of Highways, and to proceed with the usual procedure, that of passing on the three readings.


The commission has been asked to consider the possibility of installing a few lights on Highway 72 toward Battle Creek. The commission is in favor of this but permission must be granted by the State Highway Dept. Alderman Peoples is to proceed with this through the S.V.E.C.

The utilities are being moved on Kimball Lane and arrangements have been for the money to pay for this.

Hamilton Appliances has had a plate with the number to call in case of fire, to be placed on the telephone dial, and has distributed them to the residents of Kimball. The Town assumed half the cost of the plates, which was \$18.00, and appreciates their interest in this matter.

The possibility of annexing additional territory to the Town of Kimball was discussed, but no action was taken due to more needed information.

Mayor Bennett stated that he had recieved notice of the annual Tennessee Municipal League meeting which will be held in Gattkingburg on the 17th, 18th, and 19th of June. Mayor Bennett said that he would attend this Meeting provided all expenses and losses involved would be paid by the the Town, other wise he would not be able to go. Alderman Peoples made a motion that he attend, the motion seconded by Alderman Shook.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.


Mayor Bennett consulted Road Commissioner Pete Graham about surfacing the street from the Roller Rink to the end toward the mountain on the south side of the new addition. Mayor Bennett wanted this done immediately, but Commissioner Graham suggested that Mr. Perkinson of the State Highway Department be contacted about the drainage problem along Highway 41.

The Highway Department had been informed in the past about this condition and the City Commission had met with the State Officials at the location of this street and Highway and the situation discussed. The state promised to do something about the situation, but the promises were never carried out.

Seeing the need for the improvement on this street, Mayor Bennett contacted Alderman Shook and both were in agreement to proceed at once on this work for they did not wish to wait any longer for the state to fulfill their promise. Mayor Bennett was unable to contact Alderman Peoples at this time, but knowing that he had great concern about this and felt as we did we decided that the street should be surfaced now.

Alderman Shook, by request of Mayor Bennett, contacted Commissioner Graham and through his cooperation the street has been surfaced.




