Mayor Bennett stated that he had recieved a letter from Jim Bell, Industrial Specialist, asking that Kimball give as much or more than they had the previous year. Kimball more than did it's share by giving \$750.00 which was more than \$1.00 per person. This amount exceeded that given by other Towns. Mayor Bennett suggested that Kimball give the same per person as did South Pittsburg. This amount would be .61¢ per person. Alderman Shook moved that give this amount, which was seconded by Alderman Peoples. The vote was unanimous.

Mayor Bennett reported that a pre-fabricating plant was to locate on the property that was the Huber plant. Pre-fab houses are to be built.

Arequest to set up an air sampling station at Kimball, was recieved by Mayor Bennett, and after discussion by the Board, Mayor Bennett moved that the Tennessee State Health Department be permitted to set the station up on the Kimball School Property. Alderman Shook seconded the motion, and the vote was unanimous.

The Marion County Hi-way Dept. was asked to do some repair to the streets. This will be done as soon as possible.

The effort to obtain a sanitary land-fill by So. Pittsburg did not materialize, sinse Jasper and Kimball already have adequate dumping grounds and do not wish to make a change at this time.

Alderman Shook reported that the garbage pick-up was perfect in every respect, and all materials that would burn was burned at the dump.

The meeting was called to order and minutes were read.

Mayor Bennett had asked that a meeting be scheduled between a representative of the State Highway Department and the Kimball officials so they could get together and work out a solution to the drainage problem on Highway 41. Instead, a Mr. Taylor from Chattanooga came over without any notification. Unable to find Mayor Bennett, he contacted Alderman Shook. They looked the situation over and Mr. Taylor agreed to clean a small portion of the ditch but would not agree to do anything to help the drainage problem. Mr. Taylor said "The drainage situation has been caused by the property owners filling in the ditches on the existing highway on both sides of the road". He explained to Mr. Shook that it would take a major construction project with adequate storm sewers to properly drain the city streets which is U. S. Highway 41.

Mayor Bennett contacted Commissioner Graham and told him to do whatever he could to help the drainage to keep the water off of the property owners below the highway.

John Hargis was told about the waste situation at the skating rink. He agreed to contact Bill Lawrence and have him make arrangements to stop this type waste disposal.

Attorney Swafford drew up the Fireworks Ordinance which prohibits the sale of fireworks in certain areas.

No other business being offered, the meeting was adjourned.
