

January 17, 1983

The Board of Mayor and Aldermen of Kimball, Tennessee met in its regular Board meeting January 17, 1983 at 7 p.m. in the Kimball Town Hall.

Mayor Lofty called the meeting to order and asked for a roll call. Those present were: Mayor Lofty, Alderman Davis, Alderman Holder, Atty. Condra, Judge Deaton and City Recorder Mary Owen. *P.C. W.*

The Mayor asked for a reading of the minutes. The minutes were read, Atty Condra said he had stated a Junk Yard must not be closer than 500 feet and a fence or hedge row was to shield it. The correction was made and Mayor Lofty made a motion the minutes be approved and Alderman Holder second the motion.

Alderman Davis stated he hasn't been able to find the water line in order to make the necessary repairs in changing the water line from the center of the Kimball Cove Road to the side. He said he would take care of this as soon as possible.

Alderman Davis said he has had some request for Van Hoosier Circle to be widened, but the one making the request isn't willing to give his share of the ride of way. He wants all the extra land it takes to widen the street to come from the opposite side of the street.

The Board discussed a resident, Mr. J. R. Jones, who lives outside the city limits that pays city taxes. The discussion was whether to return his tax money or furnish him with city benefits. It was advised his tax money be returned.

Police Chief Hargis mentioned the employees of the Police Department were interested in giving up all their fringe benefits, such as vacation, Christmas Bonuses, and anyother benefits which they receive in order for the city to pay their group insurance. The Mayor said if it meant more money involved from the city budget the city could not afford it. He said the Board would have to get together and figure before making any decisions.

Mr. Quentin LaPrad, with White, Taylor and Walder, Inc. Consulting Engineers introduced his firm. to the Board members. He stated he would be glad to help assist Kimball in floating a block grant for a water holding tank or a sewer system. The Mayor said he felt the city would be interested in the water system but the board would have to get with him and talk at a later date.

The Mayor said a bill to James & Co. for \$1,008.70 has been paid but needs to be approved. Mayor Lofty made a motion for the bill to be approved, Alderman Davis second the motion, Alderman Holder voted aye.

Alderman Holder gave the Police Report: There were 13 speeding, 2 passing on yellow line, 2 public drunkness, 2 no drivers license, 2 reckless driving, 1 violation of registration of law, Total arrest 22, Total complaints 155, Fine, litigation and accident report money collected \$554.00.

Alderman Holder gave the Fire Report - Everything OK. He said Mr. Clyde Boyd had called and requested a bill for \$100.00 to send to his insurance company for the Kimball Grain Fire. He said this would go to the Fire Fund.

Mayor Lofty made motion the meeting adjourn, Alderman Holder second the motion and the meeting was adjourned.

FEBRUARY 21, 1983

The Board of Mayor and Aldermen held their regular Board Meeting, Monday, February 21, 1983 at 7 p.m. in the Kimball Town Hall.

The Mayor called the meeting to order and asked for a roll call. Those present were Mayor Lofty, Alderman Davis, Alderman Holder Judge Deaton, Atty Condra and City Recorder Mary Owen. *Chief Hargis*

The Mayor asked for a reading of the minutes. The minutes were read and Mayor Lofty made a motion the minutes be approved. Alderman Davis second the motion and Alderman Holder voted aye.

Mayor Lofty stated a Beer License Has been issued to Kimball Shell Service Station.

The Mayor began the meeting by expressing his regrets concerning the loss of the annexation lawsuit. Atty Condra said that he and Atty Swafford could not agree on the language of the court, so it was being contested. Atty Condra mentioned the fact the city could have a new trial. The Board discussed the lawsuit and decided to discuss it further with the atty.

Mayor Lofty said he wanted to clarify a question that has been brought up about beer being sold in Kimball. He stated a law has been set up with limitations as to where beer can be sold and he wasn't going to change it. Atty Condra stated it was a State Law also. Mayor Lofty said it would have to go before the Beer Board and a ammendment would have to be made before a license could be issued for any other location.

Mayor Lofty said there has been a bug problem reported which needs to be taken care of. Jim Kirk with the ambulance has reported there are quit a few in the ambulance dept. Mr. Robert Thomas of Bridgeport was recommended to take care of this project.

Alderman Davis reported most of 3 days labor was required to repair the water line in the middle of Kimball Cove Road. Totaling \$180.00.

Alderman Davis reported street patching was fixing to start as soon as the Asphalt Plant opens. He said several have asked if Kimball Cove would be paved but he stated money is the problem. Soon as the city can appropriate enough money to pave some streets it will be considered.

Jackie Blankenship brought up the subject of Sun Cablevision not standing up to their contract supplying 20% of the Kimballs citizen with cable. He stated he had talked with them and they remarked they did not know if they would ever put anymore in Kimball. Atty Condra said if they don't stand up to the contract Kimball could bring suit or pull the franchise.

Alderman Davis asked if some NO LITTERING signs could be purchased. He said it looked like Kimball needed a few put up around the town. He specifically asked for one to be put out on Old Hwy. 41.

Mr. Jackson asked if Kimball had a live stock ordinance. He stated goats were getting on his porch and other peoples and in gardens. Chief Hargis said the goats belongs to someone outside the city limits. Mayor Lofty said he wasn't sure if there was an ordinance to the effect but he would check on it.

Alderman Holder gave the Police Report: There were 13 speeding, 1 no drivers license, 1 failure to yield blue lights, 7 reckless driving, 4 public drunkenness, 1 poss. of marj. 2 failure to stop for school bus, 3 ignoring stop sign, 1 improper passing, total arrest 33, total complaints, 210 total fine, litigation and accident report money collected \$1,095.00.

The fire report there were no fires, but there was a Mutual

Aid Meeting at Whitwell, Tenn. and the TBI is trying to move the Arson Squad under TBI and have 4 Arson Squad for the whole state - that will make it almost impossible to get a Fire Marshall in the County, Alderman Holder said. The Mutual Aid decided to draw up a letter protesting.

Alderman Holder said he would like to explain how the Beer question came about. He stated Mrs. Grace Eaves asked him to talk with the board about issuing a beer license to her for Turney's Grocery. He said he had no intention of voting for an approval because he did not drink and he was not in favor of it. He said Mrs. Eaves came down and asked him to just drop the subject because she thought she had the store sold and she did not need ^{a license} it. He said he felt there was a misunderstanding about the board wanting to change the ordinance. Mayor Lofty said it would have had to come before the Beer Board before any action was passed.

Mayor Lofty made a motion the meeting adjourn, Alderman Davis second the motion and the meeting was adjourned.

The Board of Mayor and Aldermen of Kimball, Tennessee met in its regular board meeting March 21, 1983 at 7 p.m. in the Kimball Town Hall.

The Mayor called the meeting to order and asked for a roll call. Those present were: Mayor Lofty, Alderman Davis, Alderman Holder, Judge Deaton, Chief Hargis and Recorder Mary Owen.

The Mayor asked for a reading of the minutes. The minutes were read, Mayor Lofty made a motion the minutes be approved, Alderman Davis second the motion and Alderman Holder voted aye.

The Mayor commenced the Garbage Truck was in need of repairing. He suggested the boys use the truck which was purchased recently. Mayor Lofty said that was the purpose of purchasing the truck was to collect garbage in it and it has been used very little.

Mayor Lofty continued the meeting stating Robert Thomas should spray all the buildings for bugs. He said spraying one building would not solve the bug problem.

Mayor Lofty said Alderman Holder mentioned installing a fire plug at the junction where McDonald's will be building. He said he also agreed that a fire plug needs to be installed but in order to get a fire plug a 6" water line will have to be installed.

The Mayor suggested having a meeting with all the businesses who are now on the Sewer System. There has been a problem with the Sewer Systems financial status which needs to be solved. The board decided to have the meeting March 31, at 7 p.m. at the Kimball Town Hall. Mayor Lofty asked the recorder to write a letter informing all businesses to come.

Alderman Davis said a NO LITTERING sign needs to be put up on Old 41. He stated people are throwing dead dogs out there.

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
Alderman Davis said the people have been asking about Kimball Cove Road being paved. He said he didn't think the city had enough money at the present time. Mayor Lofty recommended having the road graded smooth and resurfaced. He stated the road needs fixing badly. Alderman Davis and Mayor Lofty agreed to check with W. N. Lofty about the cost. Alderman Davis said he would check with him within the next few days. The Mayor said a tile needs to be put in to help take care of the water and turn it to the creek.

Alderman Holder said Jimmy Humble informed him that Kimball Fire Dept. would receive five (5) Fire Coats.




Mayor Lofty stated same Reynolds will be reinstated as Judge the first of May.

Mayor Lofty asked what happens to the Fire Report money. Alderman Holder said it is turned in for deposit with a receipt but lately there hasn't been any.


Alderman Davis asked if Ordinance # 27 should be amended. Attorney Condra said you can draft it, amend it or repeal it, and have a broader scope like the state law.

The Board of Mayor and Aldermen of Kimball met in its regular board meeting, May 16, 1983 at 7 p.m. in the Kimball Town Hall.

The Mayor called the meeting to order and asked for a roll call and reading of the minutes. Those present were: Mayor Lofty, Aldermen Davis, Alderman Holder, Atty Condra, Judge Reynolds and City Recorder Mary Owen. Mayor Lofty made a motion the minutes were approved and Alderman Davis second the motion.

The Mayor said he has discussed the \$50.00 minimum fee on the Sewer System with the office of the Board of Water and Sewer in South Pittsburg. He stated that he and George Young would meet with them later to set up a billing system for the \$50.00 minimum fee.

Mayor Lofty stated Judge Reynolds, Mr. C.C. Atnip and Alderman Davis have been appointed to serve on the Sewer Committee. Two more are needed to serve.

The 1980 Police Car needs repairing, one bid has been received from Moss Motors, for \$1,132.27 with a 90 day warranty or 4,000 miles, the other for 1,318.00 with a 12 months or 12,000 miles.

Eleven Hundred dollars was transferred to General Funds from Revenue Sharing.

A question was asked if bids should be taken for an auditor or keep the same one. Alderman Holder made a motion to keep the same one, and Alderman Davis second the motion.

Alderman Davis said he has discussed road funds with the auditor and he said as long as the money was used for anything affiliated with streets it can be used. Mayor Lofty made a motion to let Jim Slatton do the work in clearing the drain ditches and Alderman Davis second the motion.

The Mayor returned the check to John Hargis which he paid for his Police Uniform Pants. Mayor Lofty stated the city has paid for all others therefore the Chief shouldn't have to pay for his.

The Board decided to purchase a chain saw and some small tools for the city. Judge Sam Reynolds said he had a small Poulan he would sell for Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) if the city was interested. Mayor Lofty made a motion to purchase the saw from Judge Reynolds, Alderman Davis second the motion. Mayor Lofty asked Alderman Davis if he would check on some small tools to buy.

The Boys that work for Manpower will be here the second week of June.

The light in the Ambulance Dept. Office needs repairing. Judge Reynolds and Chief Hargis said they would do the repairs.


The dump truck tires are worn out. Mayor Lofty made a motion to purchase some tires. Alderman Davis second the Motion.


Atty Condra stated the Chancellor will be down for the docket of the Young versus City case the first of June.

Mayor Lofty said Kimball will not receive Revenue Sharing for Fiscal Year 1983-84. This will cause a shortage of funds for Kimball if they are cut out.

Alderman Holder reported the water line in Bennett Subdivision is a 6" Line.

Mayor Lofty reported he has asked for bids on the audit for 1982-83 audit. Merlin and Edmonston bid under \$3,950., J. B. Frost \$1,200. and James & Company \$1,175. The Board agreed to continue with James & Co.

Kimball Cove Road has been paved. The Board said if anyone has to dig into the road or anyother road in Kimball they would have to fix the road as was at their own expense.

Berton Cagle has applied for a Beer License. The Board decided there should not be any problems with issuing him a license.

The Mayor stated the city has a problem concerning a sign being painted on a storage building in Kimball. This particular building promised not to paint signs on the building at the time of the building permit. Signs are

being painted on the building. Upon motions made and seconded and unanimously adopted correcting the attorney. Determine the ownership of the right of way joining Carters property.




Alderman Davis said a street light needs to be installed at the end of the Access Road. Mayor Lofty made a motion the light be installed and Alderman Davis second the motion.

A bill for \$9,200. was paid from State Street Aid Funds to W. N. Lofty Paving and Asphaltting, Dunlap, Tenn. for paving Kimball Cove Road.

The Mayor said more revenue was going to have to be appropriated. The Board discussed increasing property taxes and a garbage pickup fee. The Mayor said he had rather make a decision on one of the other and not increase property taxes and also charge a garbage pickup fee. No motions were made at the time.

The Mayor asked Atty Condra if he had any news concerning the sign on the building. The subject was discussed but no motions were made.

Alderman Holder gave the Police and Fire reports. There were 30 arrest. \$110.25 Litigation Tax, \$553.25 Police Fines, Totaling \$663.50. There were 3 fires reported.

Mayor Lofty made a motion the meeting adjourn, Alderman Davis second the motion.

Alderman Davis said this has been the reason it hasn't been used because of the hydraulic filter and it uses so much hydraulic fluid which cost 5 to 6 gallons.

Atty. Condra reported the status of the Young versus Kimball Case. The wrong Chancellor signed the order overruled the motion to be dropped, so he had to sign another motion to set aside that order to have the proper

order entered and forward it on to Mr Swafford. He has approved the new order which Attorney Condra had resubmitted and has sent it to the right Chancellor. It was a clerical error to Chancellor Stewart. Atty Condra asked if the board wanted this matter. proceeded. Alderman Davis made a motion to proceed ahead and Alderman Holder second the motion.

Alderman Holder said a discussion was mde upon the Carter Building and signs at the Dixie Lee Junction. At this time a delay for any decisions on this matter are being withheld until the previous meeting due to the absence of Mayor Lofty.

Alderman Davis reported Virgil Thomas has contracted Earth Movers to do the work next to the Church of Christ preachers home where all the complaints have been made. Mayor Lofty has requested Alderman Davis get J. Slatton dig the drain ditch out to take care of the water.

Alderman Davis said he has got the County to do some bush hogging on Raulston Town Road and Access Road and Van Hoosier Circle for \$10.00 per hour.



Alderman Davis gave a report on the Landfill of the last meeting. The County purchased the Acuff property for the landfill.


Alderman Holder gave the police report. There were 21 arrest, \$866.00 collected. Fine \$724.50, Litigation \$136.50, Accident \$5.00.

Atty Condra stated he was unable to find anything concerning Kimball owning the property near Jimmy Carters storage building.




The Mayor called the meeting to order, Those present were Mayor Lofty, Alderman Holder, Alderman Davis, and City Recorder Mary Owen.

The Board of Mayor and Aldermen of Kimball met in its regular Board Meeting, October 17, 1983 at 7 p.m. in the Kimball Town Hall.

The Mayor called the meeting to order and asked for a roll call and reading of the previous minutes. Those present were Mayor Lofty, Alderman Davis, Alderman Holder, Attorney Condra, Judge Reynolds and City Recorder Mary Owen. *Chief Hargis.*

The Mayor made a motion the minutes be approved, Alderman Davis second the motion and Alderman Holder voted aye.

The Mayor expressed that after discussing the garbage pickup fee it would be better to have a garbage pick up fee than to raise the land owners taxes. He discussed Ordinance No. 51 and made a motion the Ordinance be approved, Alderman Holder second the motion and Alderman Davis voted aye.

The Attorney asked for the Ordinance be put in the newspaper the following week. The Mayor stated the first of November will began the collecting of fees. He also stated for those who wish to haul their own garbage will not be billed but if they haul it to the garbage truck and the city has to haul it to the landfill, they will be charged.

Walker Oil had the lowest bid therefore, gasoline was purchased from them. From now on if the price goes over \$1.00 per gallon it will be bidden.

It was decided by the Board to have the 81 Police Car motor repaired. The bill is \$1,340. from Moss Motors and they also purchased new tires for the Police Car for \$201.39 from Valley Tire. Alderman Holder said the car still needs a new tail pipe on it.

Mayor Lofty said the 1983-84 Budget was to be approved. He read the budget and Mayor Lofty made a motion the budget be adopted for 1983-84.

Alderman Holder second the motion and Mayor Lofty asked the City Recorder to put it in the newspaper.

Mayor Lofty said that Stephen Ballard has signed up for unemployment. The city will have to pay their share.

South Pittsburg Board has asked that the Board meet with their board for Sewer meeting within the next few days. A date for Tuesday, ^{Oct}~~Sept~~. 25 at 5 p.m. was set for the meeting.

A discussion was held concerning the Pickett Case. Mayor Lofty asked the City Recorder to called the insurance company and have them to inform the city as to how the case was resolved, when and why Kimball wasn't informed of the status.

Alderman Davis brought the attention of Charles Hargis being bee stung to the board. He was interested in knowing if this would be taken care of by Hargis individual insurance or if the city would have to take care of it being that Hargis was stung on the premises. The Board decided to go ahead and pay for the treatment.

Mayor Lofty made a motion to have the park mowed once more this fall, Alderman Davis second the motion.


The road on Kimball Cove near the mountain has been reported being very rough, Mayor Lofty said he would take care of this and have it graded.





Alderman Davis asked the City Recorder to find out what kind of Junk Yard Ordinance Jasper and South Pittsburg has on their Junk Yards.


