Chief Hargis was awarded a plaque of honor for the past few years he has served in Kimball.

Mayor Lofty stated S. L. Reynolds be over the Police Dept., Alderman Holder be over the Fire Dept., Alderman Williams be over the Garage and Alderman Davis be over the streets and roads.

Alderman Holder gave the Police report: There were 37 arrest, \$1,539.00 fines were collected and \$10.00 accident report money was collected totaling \$1,549.00.

The fire report was no fires in the city. Two mutual aid fires were reported which we attended. The fire department needs new fire equipment and the radio for the fire truck cost \$325.00. This must be paid in advance and in order to receive the radio it must be paid in advance.

Mayor Lofty made a motion the meeting adjourn, Alderman Davis second the motion.

Mayor Lofty made a motion to approve the 2nd reading of Ordinance #55 regarding the sewer tap fee. Alderman Williams second the motion.

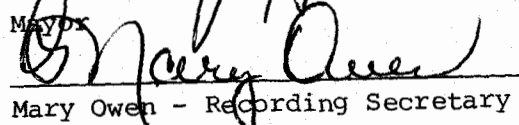

Mayor Lofty stated John Hewgley with Carter, Wilson and Hewgley Insurance had called for the bonds to be released for Mary Owen and the City Employees. Mayor Lofty made a motion to contact Patrick Insurance. Alderman Williams second the motion.

Mayor Lofty made a motion to purchase the RCA Airconditioner from Valley Tire for \$699.00. Alderman Davis second the motion. All others voted aye.

Alderman Reynolds stated Eric Wynne would start to work April 24.

1985 at the rate of pay \$180.00 per week; 3 months a \$10.00 increase and the next 3 months a \$10.00 increase. Mayor Lofty made a motion to hire Eric Wynne Alderman Reynolds second the motion. Alderman Joe Holder opposed.

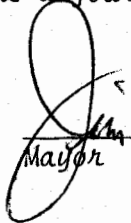
A question about the bug problem at the Police and Ambulance Dept. came up and it was decided to use Robert Thomas to come and spray.

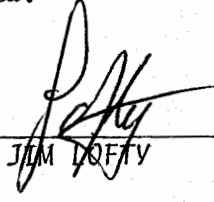

The Board approved folder files to be ordered for the office.

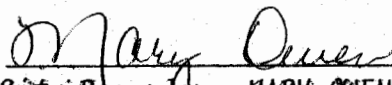

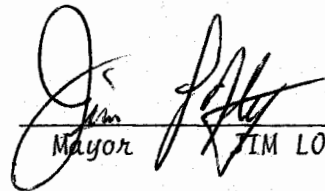

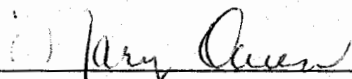
The Board of Mayor and Aldermen held a special meeting June 4, 1985 at 7:00 p.m. in the Kimball Town Hall.

The minutes were read and Mayor Lofty made a motion the minutes be approved after the names were changed from Mayor Lofty to Vice Mayor Reynolds, Alderman Davis second the motion and all others voted aye.

Karen Pope with South East Tenn. Development District was present and explained the Homecoming '86. She stated Marion County is going County wide and she would like for Kimball to have some type of project for the Homecoming '86.

Mayor Lofty gave the report on funds spent for the Sewer System, \$5,022.00 was the total, Farmers Home Adm. was paid \$2,900.00 for a payment, \$975.00 was reimbursed to State Street Aid Funds, \$1,978.00 to General Funds. A check was received from South Pittsburg Water and Sewer for the amount of \$2,522.24. Gentry paid \$1,000.00 for their tap fee. As of this date the Layman Center has not paid their fee but plans to within the next few days.

Mayor Lofty said the town had to purchase a copy machine. Mayor Lofty made a motion to purchase the copier, Alderman Davis second the motion. Payments will be split in two payments next fiscal year budget. This will be purchased from Duplicator Supply Co, Chattanooga, Tenn.

Mayor Lofty said the Ambulance Dept and Police Dept have been sprayed by Robert Thomas.

Mayor Lofty stated no one was required to serve out his term. He said the board could appoint someone to fill a position if someone resigns.

A question was asked if the Election Office would accept a business person voting in Kimball although they did not live here. The Election Office stated that the Kimball report states 4 aldermen for 2 years terms. If a person resigns the board will appoint someone to fill that position for that term.

Mayor Lofty said that some of the business people think their fire insurance is too high and that he plans to seek into uprating Kimball's Fire Dept.

Mayor Lofty opened the sealed bids on the asphalt job. Claude Brown bid \$77,605.00, T.V. Paving Co., Charles Payne \$28,000.00 and W. N. Lofty Paving bid \$21,612.50. Alderman Davis made a motion to accept W. N. Lofty Paving Company and Alderman Williams second the motion and the other board members voted aye.

Mayor Lofty asked if Joe Holder has paid the \$164.28 bill he owes the town, City Recorder Mary Owen answered no.

Alderman Reynolds gave the Police Report. There were 39 arrests, \$1,710.00 monies collected plus \$4.00 miscellaneous monies collected.

Mayor Lofty made a motion to purchase a weed eater from Don Williams and Alderman Davis second the motion. The price of the weed eater was \$135.00.

Alderman Joe Holder recommended the board get someone to take care of the Fire Dept. because it took more time than he has time for. He also stated Kimball would be responsible for the next Mutual Aid Dinner.

Mayor Lofty made a motion to adjourn the meeting, Alderman Williams second the motion. The meeting was adjourned.

City Recorder Mary Owen stated the Layman Center has paid their Sewer tap fee of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) and promises to pay fifteen hundred more within the next 30 to 60 days from June 27, 1985.

Mayor Lofty stated he has talked with a Fire Marshall representing the state about the upgrading of the Fire Dept. in order to help reduce the insurance the rates for the citizens of Kimball. He advised the board to check with ISO Commercial Risk Services for further information.

The Board gave the Fire Dept permission to elect a new Fire Chief and began improving the Fire Dept.

Mayor Lofty asked about an air conditioner for the community center. The board decided to purchase a 24,000 BTU unit. Mayor Lofty made a motion to purchase the air condition and Alderman Davis and

Mayor Lofty said the work on the roads has been completed. W. N. Lofty Paving Company of Dunlap, Tenn. did the work. The Lane, Old 41 out toward Jere Davis home has been paved. Alderman Davis said the street by Leland Gudgers home is in a terrible condition and some signs needs to be ordered. Mayor Lofty said John A. Hargis has been supervising the Garbage boys and the Street Dept crew. He said he was in favor of paying John a 10% reaise or \$25.00 week more from the State Street Funds for this work.

Alderman Reynolds said it is time for Eric G. Wynne to receive an increase of \$10.00 each week. This will make him making a salary of \$190.00 per week.

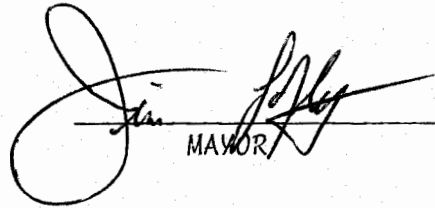

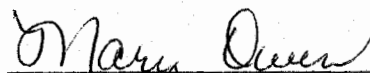
Alderman Reynolds said a phone has been installed for the Fire and Police Dept. He asked for one more dispatcher.

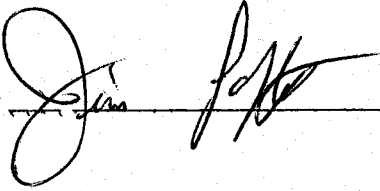
Alderman Reynolds presented the Homecoming '86 certificate.

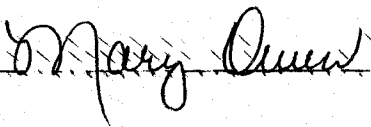

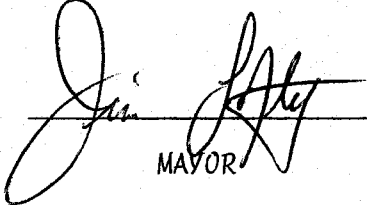


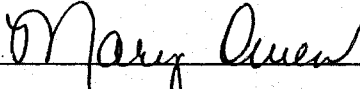

Mayor Lofty said we needed to try to locate someone to clean the office and community center.

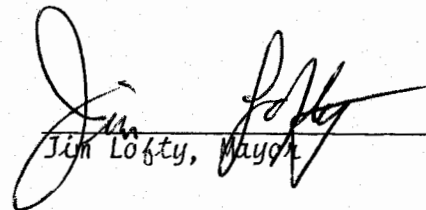
Mayor Lofty asked for a report on the roads. Alderman Davis said the roads look in good shape. The Mayor said they could do some patching before winter.

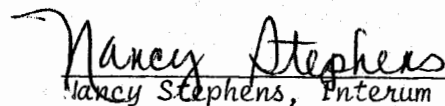

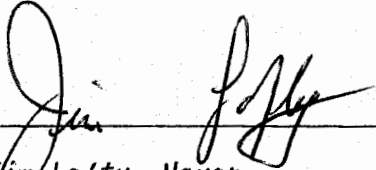

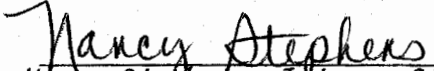

Mayor Lofty made the motion for the meeting to adjourn. Alderman Williams second the motion. Alderman Davis voted aye.

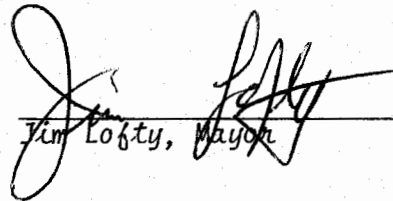

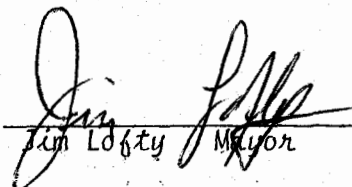
The Police Report was given by Alderman Reynolds. It read as follows:
