Vice-Mayor Reynolds called the meeting to order and asked for a roll call. Those present were: Vice Mayor Reynolds, Alderman Williams, Alderman Church and Attorney Condra.

The total on the fine money was \$1842.00 The community center rent was \$10.00 and Accident report money was \$25.00. Making a grand total of all fine and misc. money \$1877.00.


Fire Chief Davis gave the Fire Report. There had been 8 fires--6 were brush-1 was a car and 1 was where they assisted the County. He said the tanker was in good shape with the new valve. The firemen went to a weekend school- 6 Firemen and 4 Pookies attended. Jackie Blankenship will now be an assistant. Mr. Davis said Mr. Green, with ISO, had ok'ed the hand drawn map of our boundaries. Mr. Davis also said they had a "planned fire" scheduled for Feb. 22 and 23 and we were invited to see the equipment in use. Vice Mayor Reynolds said he thought the Fire Dept. was doing a good job and that he was proud of them.







February 25, 1986

On February 25, 1986, the Kimball Board of Mayor and Aldermen met in the Town Hall for the monthly board meeting.

Mayor Lofty called the meeting to order and asked for a roll call and a reading of the previous minutes. Those present were: Mayor Lofty, Alderman Church, Alderman Davis, Alderman Williams and Attorney Condra. The minutes were read and the Board made the following ammendment: Mrs. Stephens is to send Business License notices to businesses who are late in renewing their license. After this change was made, Mayor Lofty made the motion the minutes be approved and Alderman Davis second the motion.

Mayor Lofty made the motion that Nancy Stephens be put in as full time City Recorder at Mary Owen's old salary (\$235.59). Alderman Williams second the motion. All voted aye.

Mayor Lofty asked for the Fire report. It was given by Assistant Jackie Blankenship. They had had 2 fires inside the City; one was a yard fire and the other a car. They had assisted on 2 fires outside the City. They had had an average of 6 men responding to each fire. Mr. Blankenship said they had attended the State Approved Training Burn in Jasper on February 22 & 23. They had seven (7) men to attend this. They have now had their radio repaired. They are still waiting to hear from the ISO about an inspection date. They have had three (3) new members this month.

The Fire Dept. asked the City to buy two (2) pumpers. One was a 1950 Ford from the City of Mt. Juliet for \$801.00 and the other was a 1951 Ford from Emergency One (Hudson Fire Apparatus) in Nashville for \$2000.00. Mr. Blankenship said with a little work he felt like these could be fixed up and maybe help us get a better insurance rating. Mayor Lofty made the motion we buy the 1950 Ford from the City of Mt. Juliet for \$801.00. Alderman Davis second the motion.



Mayor Lofty asked the City Hall to cut back on the Police Force. He said we needed to watch the Budget for this year.




Lofty Grading and Paving bid 32.50 per ton. Mayor Lofty made the motion we give the asphalt job to W. N. Lofty Paving. Aldermen Williams and Davis second the motion.

The Fire report for April was as follows: (1) Mutual Aid Fire- Graham feed store- man power used only (1) Fire at Kelly Whicher's residence-a chimney fire- There was a small amount of damage. The ISO will be here April 23 about 10:30 A.M. The parts are still on order for the truck on the lot.

Chief Hargis gave the Police report. It was as follows: Total arrests 39; total complaints 200; Litigation Tax collected 157.50; Fine money collected 1191.50. Total on Fine money was 1349.00. Community center rent was 10.00; Accident report money was 6.00; and Garbage money was 9.00. Making a grand total of 1374.00.

With no other business, Mayor Lofty made the motion the meeting be adjourned.

Mayor Lofty called the meeting to order and asked for a roll call and a reading of the previous minutes. Those present were: Mayor Lofty, Vice Mayor Reynolds, Alderman Church, Alderman Davis, Alderman Williams and Attorney Condra.

The Ford truck had been sent to Murfreesboro Fire School. All leaks and valves had been fixed or replaced. The truck was certified by the State Fire School. The ISO was notified in hopes this would help our grade. Joe Holder had not returned their call about the truck outside. The Ford truck is in service--ready to fight fires.


City Recorder Nancy Stephens asked the Mayor if she could give a report on



The Mayor called the meeting to order and asked for a roll call and reading of the minutes of the previous meeting. Sun Cable representative Cleaver talked of selling the assets of Sun Cablevision to Johnson Pardine.

In effect, it would just be a name change. They will abide by the same franchise as Sun Cablevision is operating under now. Bids on the Sewer Project were discussed. Danny Thomas bid \$11,800 plus <sup>★</sup>30 cubic yard to shoot rock--Kimball<sup>o</sup> furnishes all materials. Also will be adding a few more feet and extension will cause an increase. No other bids were turned in to be opened.

Road report: Van Hoosier Circle and Ponderosa Circle were asphalted.





The Minutes were read and Mayor Lofty made the motion they be approved as read. Alderman Williams second the motion.





On Tuesday, May 26, 1986, the Kimball Board of Mayor and Aldermen met in the Town Hall for their regular monthly Board meeting.

The Sign Ordinance was discussed and the City Recorder was asked to look up all notes on this for later discussion. It was tabled for now.





On October 28, 1986, the Kimball Board of Mayor and Aldermen met in the Town Hall for the regular monthly Board meeting.

The Mayor called the meeting to order and asked for a roll call and a reading of the previous minutes. Those present were: Mayor Lofty, Vice-Mayor Reynolds and Alderman Williams. The minutes were read and Mayor Lofty made the motion they be approved as read. Vice-Mayor Reynolds second the motion.

Ann Gray with the Marion County Planning Commission introduced Mr. Stanley Harrison as the Regional Director for the Planning Commission.

Mayor Lofty made the motion Ordinance # 56 be approved on Second Reading. Vice-Mayor Reynolds second the motion. All voted aye. The Mayor also announced we would have the third and final reading of Ordinance # 56 on Thursday, October 30, 1986--7:00 P.M. in the Town Hall. The meeting would also cover the First Reading of the 1986-87 Budget for the Town. [Recorder's note: This was also published in the local newspapers and Public Notices were posted in the windows of local businesses.]

Paul Johnson was here to go over the 1985-86 audit. He said Kimball looked better than ever before; we had had a very good year. He stated approximately \$51,000.00 had been spent on the roads in Kimball. Approximately \$23,000 was from the General Fund and \$28,000. from the Street Fund. He said Revenue Sharing has now run out. We should get one more check. The Sewer Fund had a profit of \$2,334. Mr. Johnson said this looked good for now and the future too.

The Mayor asked Mrs. Stephens to draw up a Road Permit form. It would read as follows: "Be it known, from this day forward, anyone wishing to cut a road within the limits of the Town of Kimball must first come to the Town Hall and sign a permit stating when they are finished with their work---whether it's water lines, sewer lines, whatever, they will repair the road to where it is

as good shape (if not better) than before they cut it.

The Party doing the work will have thirty (30) days from the completion date to make any necessary repairs. Any Contractor failing to comply with the above shall be subjected to all cost incurred by the Town to make the necessary repairs and collect the money."


The Contractor would sign and date the permit and a copy would be kept in the Town Hall .



Total Fine money collected \$1788.00. Accident report money was \$12.00; Community Center money was \$20.00. This mad a Grand Total of Fine and miscellaneous monies \$1820.00.




Mayor Lofty called the meeting to order and asked for a roll call. Those present were: Mayor Lofty, Alderman Church and Alderman Williams.


Chief Hargis said they were to receive the new radios this week.

Mayor Lofty asked for a Fire Report. It was as follows for the months of October and November: Three (3) Mutual Aid fires; Two (2) in Jasper and (1) in South Pittsburg. They had had a training burn across from Gentry Chevrolet. 100' for 2½" hose had been donated and 150' of 1½" had been donated. The trucks had all been winterized and all were in working order. 


He said the cost of the tank would be about \$600. or so. Mayor Lofty made the motion they buy the tank. Alderman Davis second the motion. All voted aye.
