R. L. Davis resigned as Fire Chief for the Town of Kimball. He said he felt the Town needed someone that would be able to devote more time than what he is able to do at this time.

Mayor Lofty said he thought we could get \$500.00 for the fire truck. Vice-Mayor Reynolds made the motion we sell it and Alderman Williams second the motion.


Mayor Lofty made the motion we adopt the TML Manual for the Police Department. Alderman Williams second the motion.

Assistant Fire Chief Jackie Blankenship gave the fire report as follows: They had had 6 fires---5 were Mutual Aid (2 in South Pittsburg) (2 in New Hope) and (1 in Jasper)--- 1 fire had been in Kimball. It was a chimney fire and was put out by the time the Police Officers arrived; no engines responded. The dump tank had been assembled and was on the truck.. All trucks are in good order.


The Police report was given as follows by Chief John Hargis: Total arrests 140; total complaints 275; Litigation money collected \$309.75; Fine money collected 2802.25; making a total of fine and litigation money 3112.00. The garbage fees were 36.00; accident reports were 36.00; Police patches were 11.00; and the Community Center rent was 5.00. This made a total of fine and miscellaneous monies \$3200.00.


Ann Gray with the Planning Commission, was at the meeting to discuss the proposed Ordinance #58 regarding Flood Insurance. This was only a discussion, not a First Reading.

Mayor Lofty asked for the Fire report. It was given by Jackie Blankenship as follows; There had been (2) grass fires; (1) standby for a wreck; and (1) cat up a tree. The trucks were in good order. The tires had been changed on the trucks and Mr. Blankenship said the Ford rode a lot better. The firemen had had a Fire meeting on February the 17th. Jackie Blankenship was elected Chief and Mark Payne, Wayne Peoples and Carl Taylor were elected assistants. Chief Blankenship stated the firemen needed at least (2) more air tanks. After discussion of air packs and prices, the Board gave the firemen permission to order the (2) tanks. They said the cost would be approximately \$2000.

Mayor Lofty asked for the Police report. It was given by Chief John Hargis as follows: There had been 39 arrests and 220 complaints. Litigation money collected was 215.25 and fine money was 1889.75. This made a total of \$2105.00. Miscellaneous monies were: Garbage fees 9.00; accident reports 12.00; and community center rent 20.00. This made a grand total of all monies \$2146.00.

March 24, 1987

On Tuesday, March 24, 1987, the Kimball Board of Mayor and Aldermen met in the Town Hall for their regular monthly Board meeting.

The Mayor called the meeting to order and asked for a roll call and a reading of the previous minutes. Those present were: Mayor Lofty, Vice-Mayor Reynolds, Alderman Cooley, Alderman Davis Alderman Williams and Attorney Condra. The minutes were read and Mayor Lofty made the motion they be approved as read. Vice-Mayor Reynolds second the motion. All voted aye.

Mayor Lofty made the motion we appoint Mark Payne III as Alderman in Mark Payne, Jr.'s absence--due to illness. This was second by Alderman Davis. All voted aye.

Mayor Lofty asked Vice-Mayor Reynolds to introduce Jerry W. Childers Judge Don Williams to swear him in as Kimball's new Police officer. (This was due to the vacancy left by Ron Gibbs going to New Hope.) Mr. Childers took the oath of Policeman and was scheduled to go to work on March 26, 1987 for the Town.

Mayor Lofty made the motion we run and ad for the Town to receive sealed bids on the wrecked 1980 Police car and the 1952 Ford pumper. The vehicles will be sold "as is". Bids will be opened at the April 28th Board meeting. The Police car can be seen at Connie Bowman's Wrecker Service and the pumper can be seen at the Fire Dept. Vice-Mayor Reynolds second the motion. All voted aye.

Mayor Lofty stated we had received a letter from Marion County School Board Superintendent, John Shelly, requesting the Town to approve the "Contract" School Board to "borrow" Two Hundred Seventy Nine Thousand Dollars (279,000) from the School Bond Sinking Fund. This would be on a 15 year basis. It would be paid back \$10,000. a year for the first 10 years and \$35,800. a year for the last 5 years. Vice-Mayor Reynolds made the motion we approve the loan and Alderman Davis second the motion. All voted aye.

March 24, 1987 cont.

Mayor Lofty made the motion we approve the First Reading of Ordinance #58. This is an Ordinance "to prevent flood damage; to regulate construction in special flood hazard areas; to establish permit procedures; to establish variance procedures; to establish specific standards; and to provide penalties for violations hereof." Alderman Cooley second the motion. All voted aye.

Mayor Lofty stated we had received the contract from Marion County Planning Development agreeing to provide services to the Town. The services would include the following: (1) assistance with the administration of the Town's subdivision regulations, which are those of the Marion County Regional Planning Commission and (2) Assistance with the administration of the Town's Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance and (3) limited assistance on other community and economic development projects. The agreement would be for one year period--October 1, 1986 to September 30, 1987 and could be extended by subsequent periods of one year by the mutual consent of both parties. Mayor Lofty made the motion we sign the agreement. Vice-Mayor Reynolds second the motion. All voted aye.

Mayor Lofty asked for the Fire report. It was given by Fire Chief Jackie Blankenship as follows: There had been (2) fires in the City: (1) brush fire on Kingsberry Dr. and (1) structure fire at the John B. Wooten residence. They had received the 2 new air packs and spare bottles. One was not working right so it was returned. They should have that one repaired or a new one by this Friday. The Fire Dept. had had 30 gal. of foam donated to them. This would be a donation of approximately \$500.00. The tanker had a wheel cylinder leaking. The other trucks were in good order. The roof was reported as still leaking. Jeff Stephens was getting some bids on repairing this. Chief Blankenship reported \$185, in donations had been turned in this month. He also stated all equipment had been ^{inventaried} ~~invoiced~~ and marked with our Mutual-Aid color. Chief Blankenship said there would be fire school in Murfreesboro on April the 11th and 12th and that some of the firemen would be going.

March 24, 1987 Cont.

The Police report was given by Chief John Hargis as follows: There had been 36 arrests; Fine money collected was \$2423.75 and litigation money was \$946.75. This made a total of fine money \$2670.50. Miscellaneous monies collected was: \$9.00 garbage fees and \$59.00 in miscellaneous Police reports. This made a total of \$2738.50 in Fine and Miscellaneous monies. Chief Hargis said all the cars were in pretty fair shape.

With no other business, the Mayor made the motion the meeting be adjourned. Alderman Davis second the motion. All voted aye.

C. rent was \$30.00; misc. Police reports was \$24.00. This made a grand total of \$2146.75 for Fine and misc. monies.

Mayor Lofty asked for the Fire report. It was given by Chief Blankenship as follows: There had been 3 fires inside the City; (1) at Mr. Cooley's out building (1) grass fire at I-24 and Hwy. 72 and (1) car fire at the Fruit Stand. They had had one (1) mutual aid fire in Jasper. They had also had a control burn training session.



to Sequatchee to practice drill with them. The Fire Dept. had a very good drill at the handle factory.



Mayor Lofty made the motion to purchase Blue lights for the "new" Police car. Vice-Mayor Reynolds second the motion. All voted aye.




The motion on this was made by Mayor Lofty and second by Vice-Mayor Reynolds. All voted aye.

Mayor Lofty stated there would be a 5% raise across the board for all employees not discussed in the 2 previous months. This would be effective immediately.



November 24, 1987 cont.




One plug had gone seven (7) months before anything was done. List of plugs is attached.


